Study Guide for September 20, 2009. The Cost of Compromise – Genesis 19:30-38.

Introduction: Describe a situation where there was compromise. What was the outcome?

- I. A Sordid Story: (Gen. 19:30-38)
 - 1. Why did Lot and his daughters leave Zoar? (Recall vs. 18-22)
 - 2. Where do they end up living? (Compare Lot's earlier dwelling 13:2, 19:2)
 - 3. What does Lot's older daughter propose to her younger sister? (Compare 9:20-27)
 - 4. What happens the following night? (Evaluate in light of Lev. 18:6-18)
 - 5. What is the ultimate result of these encounters? (Num. 25:1-3, Deut. 2:9, 19)
 - 6. Compare Lot's sad offer (Gen. 19:8) with this sordid outcome (vs. 32-36).
 - 7. "Sin, when it is full grown, gives birth to sin." (James 1:15) Trace the process by which sin developed and eventually gave birth to "death" in Lot's life.

II. A Stark Contrast:

- 1. Compare and contrast Lot with Abraham. (Note key choices, their prayers, their actions and influence on others)
- 2. Compare Sarah with Lot's wife and Lot's daughters.
- 3. Compare Abraham's sons (Ishmael & Isaac) with Lot's sons and sons-in-law.

III. A Sober Warning:

- 1. Read and reflect on James 4:4-6. How did Lot cultivate friendship with the world? What was the cost for this friendship? How are you susceptible to the same?
- 2. Read and reflect on I John 2:15-17. The things of this world are fleeting. How was this true in Lot's case? Where do you need this corrective in your life?
- 3. Read and reflect on Rom. 12:1-2. How can the story of Lot transform your mind?

Conclusion: "It is impossible to compromise with sin and conquer it at the same time."
