 - C. Why do you think Peter was hurt after the third question? (John 18:25-27)
 - D. What does this passage teach us about what is necessary to serve Christ?
- II. A Prophetic Exhortation: (John 21: 19-20)
 - A. What will change as Peter becomes old? (See I Cor. 6:19-20)
 - B. What is Jesus predicting? (Recall Matt. 26:35, John 13:37-38)
- C. Do you think Peter was still living when John wrote this? Why might that matter?
- D. What is Jesus final command to Peter? (See John 12:23-25)
- E. What specific challenges do you face in obeying that command?
- III. A Practical Rebuke: (John 21: 21-23)
 - A. What does Peter ask Jesus? What might be the motive for that question?
 - B. How is the other disciple identified? Why might these terms be used?
 - C. How does Jesus respond to Peter's inquiry? What lesson do we learn?
- D. What misunderstanding does John seem to be trying to resolve?
- IV. A Personal Witness and Reflection: (John 21: 24-25)
 - A. How has the theme of witness been central? (See John 1:7, 10:40-42 & 19:35)
- B. What was not told in this gospel? What can we speculate from what is left out?

Conclusion: How might you become a more faithful witness on behalf of Christ?
