Study Guide for April 28th, 2013. The Plagues I: Warning Signs. Ex. 7:14 – 8:19.

Hence, the plagues are an undoing of creation, a series of creation reversals, at Egypt's expense. . . God once again restores order to chaos as he did in the beginning. . . Each plague is a reminder of the supreme power of Yahweh, the creator." (Enns, Exodus, NDOBT)
